The staff are beginning one of their major 'Professional Learning Developments' this week: we are investigating a new tool (PaCT the Progress and Consistency Tool) to assess children's writing and to make decisions on

what next steps the children need in their writing lessons. We have an excellent teacher expert, Cath Runga, who we have engaged to help us with this. She has worked with our school several times in the past and we have always got a lot of great ideas that have helped us improve our practise. As teachers we enjoy learning too.

Unfortunately she has found the 110km (80 minutes) return trip from home to school every day too much, which is quite understandable. We have had so much positive feedback on the quality of food and service we provided.



# Junior & Middle Room Trip to the Waitomo Caves

As part of our classroom studies rooms 1 & 3 are going on a day trip to see the glow worms in the Waitomo Caves and to visit the Waitomo Caves Education Centre in the Museum.

We are planning to go next **Monday 21 May** (the same morning that the senior class goes on camp). We will need to leave Owhango early at 8:30am, (assembling at Owhango School at **8:15am SHARP**) to avoid the bus crowds and to get the discount for going in at the earlier time. Please ensure that your child has an early night on Sunday 21 May, as we have a very full day planned. In fairness to everyone, please ensure that these times are adhered to, we will not wait if you are late!

The Parent Teachers Association (PTA) has very generously offered to subsidise the trip by paying the cost of entry into the caves (\$11.00) for each child and the entry into the Education Centre (\$3.00). They are also subsidising half of the transport costs (\$5 of the \$10 per person). Many thanks to the PTA and their ongoing efforts with fundraising to help make trips such as this one affordable for all. (The PTA would also appreciate any offers of help with their association- just come to a meeting or talk with the staff to see how you can help.)

The children will need to bring along plenty of food packed in smaller sizes so that they do not eat it all at once. A drink is also needed. Please no sweets, they will be excited enough without a lot of sugar. Everyone attending will need to wear comfortable, suitable footwear for walking on a bush track; sneakers are ideal.

We will require assistance with transport and supervision of children for this trip please. All adults accompanying the trip will be allocated a small number of children to supervise for the day. Please note that this trip is not suitable for pre-schoolers due to the distraction they would create.
