### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

With cooler temperatures, we are looking at the end of our swimming season. I am really pleased with the progress the children have made in the pool despite the fickle weather. Having Tina Freeman take small group lessons has made a noticeable difference, adding on to what the teachers have done with their whole class lessons. After our Mountain Swimming Sports on Wednesday, we will select our interschool team. We will employ Tina to work with this team to hone their racing skills in preparation for this more competitive event. The school pool will close on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March.

### CLASSROOM KORERO Junior Room

The junior room students have settled well into our classroom routines and are now running a full programme. We have made huge progress in the swimming pool with students who were not confident to even get in now happily playing, splashing and putting their whole face in the water while those that were already fairly confident have been working on improving their floating (front and back) and gliding across the pool. We are excited to share our learning next week at our Swimming Display (for details see below).

Back in the classroom we have been learning 2-3 new letter-sounds a week and can use these to read and write some three letter words. Some of us will be beginning to bring some reading words or books home to show you what we can do. The older students who were here last year have been making sure they remember all the sounds they learnt last year before moving onto some new, trickier spelling patterns.

In maths we have been doing number knowledge with Mrs Tylee, looking at how each number grows by one and how the pattern repeats over and over again. We have also been doing some statistics with Mr Starkey, which is reinforcing our counting and working on some statistics: finding out what other members of the class like, or don't like; looking at different ways to show this information, and investigating how many of each colour we have of blocks, toys, felt pens etc.

In science we have been learning about rockets. We have done some cool experiments with Mr Starkey like making rockets making good observations and offering explanations about what we are seeing and why. We have also completed some lovely artwork of some flowers brought in by Whaea Regan last week.

Congratulations to former student, Ethan McLean who competed in the Freeride Junior World Championships in Kappl, Austria and ended up placed ninth.




