# **Trading Cards at School**

Over the last six months we have seen the return of trading cards (Pokémon cards etc.) amongst the students during their break times. Many schools ban these due to the disputes or disruption that they can cause.

However, I see them as a great opportunity for the kids to engage in trading, to understand the different value that they place on an item, to negotiate with their peers, and to learn about looking after their property.

The rules we have to prevent these becoming a problem and forcing a ban, are:

1) Do not bring anything to school that you do not want to lose. The school will not be spending time unravelling who owns which cards and who has not traded fairly. This is a student led activity that is optional. You do not have to participate.

2) Do not bring out your trading cards during class time. This is a break time only activity so that we do not get students who are distracted in their classroom learning.

# **CLASSROOM KORERO Junior Room**

We have a lovely junior room of fifteen Y1 & 2s this year, with a few more students expected during the vear.

We have been working on finding out about each other, what we like and what we don't like. Everyone in our class likes pizza, but most don't like peas!
