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# **SKI TIME**

Next term the school is going to Whakapapa ski field on Mt Ruapehu to learn to ski. This notice is to inform you of our plans so you can start saving your money and get ready for these trips.

We will take the year 4-8 for five days skiing, then we take the year 1-3 children for two days skiing. The first ski day (years 4-8) is planned for Friday 21 July (term 3, week 1). Friday is our skiing day for all groups.

#### Costs:

I want to thank the School Board and the Parent Teacher Association (PTA) who have once again generously offered to heavily subsidise our school skiing by about \$4,000 each, a total subsidy of \$8,000. Also thanks to Ruapehu Alpine Lifts (RAL), who currently run the ski field and give us a cheaper local rohe rate on our package. Here are the prices you will pay, after the subsidies are taken off:

Any student wanting to hire jacket and pants when they get their skis must pay an extra \$15 per trip before we go.

# **Transport:**

We will be using parent cars to get up the mountain. These cars will be reimbursed some petrol money by the Board, based on the number of passengers they take.

The pick-up for the **year 4 to 8** children will be at Owhango School, meeting at 7:25am, departing *on the dot* of 7:30am. If you are late we will not wait. From there we will go straight to Whakapapa ski field to collect our skis. The **year 1 to 3** ski trips will depart at 8am. These trips are later in the season when the weather is warmer.

# Parent Help:

We require parent help with this programme.

We need parents skiing/boarding to supervise during the day; there might be some time when the children are in a lesson when you can have a free ski/board, but you will need to return to supervise the children when their lesson has ended. If you are not a skier/boarder you are still welcome to come and enjoy a day in the café, catching up with us at lunchtime, or watching and supporting us in Happy Valley; to do this you do not need a lift pass.

For our parent helpers, we get one free ski hire and lift pass for every six students; any additional adults get charged at \$55. We divide this cost amongst all so that everyone pays the same amount if anything; often we have enough free passes to go around.

Adults may join in the children's lessons.

#### The Cost Includes:

- Skis, boots, poles & helmet hire
- Lift passes
- A 1 hour 50-minute skiing lesson by a qualified ski instructor.
- Transport to and from the mountain

### The Cost Does Not Include:

- Food
- Goggles / sunglasses (compulsory to prevent snow blindness) note that these cannot be hired.
- Warm and waterproof ski clothes

# If You Have Your Own Stuff...

If you have your own ski gear you will still need to pay \$25 for the ski lesson and lift use.

If you have your own lift pass still need to pay \$25 for the lesson.

#### Free Loan Gear:

We have two boxes of ski clothing and helmets at school you are welcome to come and borrow for the duration of the programme. First in best dressed! Please return these washed.

#### Please note:

We only teach skiing, not snowboarding as it is too difficult to organise lessons and after lesson support for both as the ability groups become too small.

# **Clothing / Equipment Requirements:**

Ski jacket – waterproof and windproof Thermals / Fleece (long sleeved top and leggings)

Ski overalls / pants waterproof Sunscreen, lip balm.

Ski goggles (better for snowy days but can get steamed up on sunny days) and/or sunglasses (best for

sunny days) Warm socks (long woollen socks are best- one pair only)

A neck warmer or balaclava Helmet – free with ski hire, we also have some to borrow at school

Gloves: it is essential they are waterproof, woollen gloves by themselves are **not suitable.** A spare pair is

a good idea as they can get wet then cold (especially if the kids are throwing snowballs!)

Tie long hair back, low at the bottom of the neck to fit the helmet over the top

Layers of clothing are preferable; as we get hot we take off layers but keep on a waterproof outer layer Also, clip toenails- it helps when toes are in fitted ski boots all day.

#### Cancellations:

We must decide to proceed or cancel a trip on the Monday before the trip to not incur a large financial penalty from Ruapehu. This decision will be based on the forecast. It is common for us to have to postpone a few times every year, due to the nature of the weather on the maunga. We aim to go when the weather is good, so the children have an enjoyable time.

#### Illness

If your child does not attend on the day we get charged for them. If we know your child will be ill, please inform us if your child will not be attending **before the day of the trip**.

# **Equity**

We have a philosophy that no children miss out because of financial constraints. If these costs are a barrier to your child/ren attending, come and talk with me in confidence so we can make other arrangements.

### Finally:

Please return the permission slips promptly so planning can resume with ease- this is quite an administrative juggling act!

Ideally, paying for the whole ski programme in one lump sum and giving permission for all the trips makes our administration a whole lot easier. However, do we need up to date information for each trip on which parents are helping. So please answer emails or fill in forms when they arrive. We are including permission slips now, for those who want to get these sorted early. However, money and permission for the first trips, years 4-8, are not due until the end of this term. This notice is more to let you know what is happening, and so you can start saving your money.
