PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES

Community Consultation Feedback: What do you perceive that makes Ōwhango School special?

The strongest comment in this section of our Community Consultation was around the great staff at our school.

This warms our hearts.

The next on the list was our rural environment / small school / community involvement / great community and families / great philosophy / rural & outdoor activities.

I think we have a great school, made special by the effort that the staff put into their work, and the support offered by our parents.

That said, I do not think we are better than other schools; this is not a competition. There are lots of great schools, and I dislike the media talking about 'good schools' or 'leading schools' as if they have a way to measure such a complex thing.

But, like children, we appreciate getting praise, it encourages us on, a lot more than criticism.

CLASSROOM KORERO- Middles

Our Visual Arts Fortnight is well under way. In the middle room we are exploring the medium of paint. To start our Arts Fortnight learning we watched a TED Talk featuring artists and musicians from Dunedin, Jane Venis and Hannah Joynt. They were using mark making to music as a form of art. We talked about abstract art, and how art can mean different things to different people, and that it doesn't necessarily have to look like a particular object.

We had a go at our own mark making. Each third of the paper was painted while listening to a different style of music. We had to think about what colours, shapes and brush strokes we were inspired to do by the music. We had 10 minutes

per section and the styles of music were classical, dubstep and jazz.

During the week we have learnt about the famous French artist, Henri Rousseau. He was a self-taught artist who was famous for his jungle scene paintings. His art was called post-impressionism which is an abstract style of art. He didn't try to paint things exactly as they looked in real life. We studied, observed and discussed his paintings, we completed jigsaws of his art pieces, read a picture book about him and through a series of technical steps, we painted our own Henri Rousseau inspired paintings, but with an Aotearoa twist.

As we head into our second week of Visual Arts Fortnight, we are moving our focus to Randal Leach, a contemporary Māori artist. We are learning about how he uses line, traditional

Māori design, colour and brushstrokes to represent the environment in his paintings. We are going to then try to use these skills to paint an extract from the myth, Rata and the Tree.
