PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES

Enrolment Scheme

The following is a notice from the Ministry of Education regarding the implementation of an enrolment scheme at Ōwhango School.

Consultation Notice

The Ministry of Education has identified that Ōwhango School is overcrowded and has given the school board notice of this. After consultation with the board, we have developed a proposed enrolment scheme for Ōwhango School under section 72 of the Education and Training Act 2020. As part of this process, we are consulting with the school's community and with people living in the area for which the school is a

reasonably convenient school. The enrolment scheme could affect which school a student will be entitled to enrol in, or school transport entitlements.

We will be holding a consultation meeting in the Ōwhango School Senior Room on Tuesday the 21st of November at 7pm to provide further information and gather feedback from the community. BUSH DAY - Senior Room

This Friday, as part of international 'Outdoor Classroom Day', the senior room will spend the school day in te ngahere (forest) down at the domain. In this time, they will engage in some science and technology challenges, team building activities, physical games, nature exploration and sensory stimulation.

This type of learning and play allows students to develop their independence, self-confidence and awareness, recognise their limitations / boundaries, utilise their natural environment to support their needs, and to better understand our natural world so that they can become kaitiaki (guardians) and protect it for future generations. All activities on the day will be closely linked to our school curriculum.

The weather at this stage does look wet for Friday but this is an all-weather event so students must come prepared with these compulsory items:

- -shoes they can get dirty/wet
- -spare, dry shoes to wear home
- -towel
- -wear old clothes to school (not uniforms)
- -spare dry, warm clothes for afterwards

- -water bottle
- -hearty lunch
- -beanie and sun hat
- -suncream (on before school/reapply during the day)
- -thermal layers to add/remove through the day-medication as necessary
- *No tools, knives, ropes or other items that may be considered dangerous to be brought to school by students. Any students carrying these items will be unable to attend this activity. Whaea Siobhan will have some items for responsible use by students.

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TONGARIRO CROSSING TRIP- Year 6-8

Kia ora e te whanau,

On the <u>8th of December</u>, as part of their PE, Health, Social Science and History curriculum, the year 6-8 students will be walking the Tongariro Alpine Crossing. We will be leaving school at 7am sharp, by bus. A decision will be made by 3pm on the 7th of December to cancel or continue as planned, based on the weather report and other safety elements. There is no postponement date for this activity.

Nga maunga hold great cultural significance to Māori and within our wider rohe (area), and the walk is heralded globally as one of the top 10 one-day walks in the world, so we are feeling very grateful to be able to extend this opportunity and privilege to our students.

This is a 19.4km hike in alpine conditions, it will be a challenge, so a reasonable level of fitness and preparation is required for this trip.

Preparation:

<u>Weekly walks</u> – All of the senior students will participate in fitness activities and weekly walks in the Ōwhango area, on Fridays, as well as their usual health and P.E. lessons. Every Friday, students are required to have comfortable walking shoes/sneakers/hiking boots (preferably what they will wear to complete the Crossing), a water bottle, raincoat, and sunscreen on. Students are welcome to carry a snack with them on these short walks. No slides, crocs, gumboots, bare feet or jandals please on Fridays.

<u>Gear list</u> – As a class, we will discuss safety considerations for the day in advance. As it is an extensive walk through variable and volcanic terrain, we expect all participants to be well prepared. The weather can change quickly and as such all items on the gear list are compulsory. Please find a recommended gear list below:

- A sturdy, well-fitting backpack with hip straps, manageable for students to carry on their own
- Tramping boots or sturdy sneakers with good tread / grip (See below)
- 3 litres of water *minimum*
- A waterproof jacket
- Thermal long sleeve top (items that are easily layered and removed)
- Fleece overtop / sweatshirt (hunting long sleeve tops are great-but cotton is not recommended)
- Thermal long johns or leggings (you may carry these in your backpack)
- Shorts
- Woollen gloves
- Neck warmer
- 2x hats beanie and a sunhat
- Thick socks (no ankle socks)
- Sunscreen (applied before leaving school and in backpack for reapplication)
- Lip balm / Chapstick
- Toilet paper/tissues
- Plasters
- Sunglasses
- Big lunch with high-energy foods included (any/all waste goes home in lunchbox)
- Lollies/chocolate are allowed for energy (No chewing gum)
- Personal medication (*Please discuss this with Whaea Siobhan in advance*)

<u>Gear check</u> - All students will be required to have their full gear list at school for inspection on <u>Friday</u> <u>1st of December</u>. We will add a reminder to our pānui that week.

<u>Tramping Boots hire</u> - Sarah Cate of Adventure Outdoors in National Park Village has kindly offered tramping boots for student's use.

If you/your child needs these for the day, please send an email to siobhan@owhango.school.nz with your child's name and EU shoe size as soon as possible. I will then collect these from Sarah (please do not contact her directly/turn up to her home to request these) for gear check on December 1st and you/your child will need to ensure these are a comfortable fit.

<u>Whanau volunteers</u> - We will need a limited number of fit and motivated whānau volunteers to support us. If you're interested, please complete and <u>return the form below by 8th of November</u>. Please familiarise yourself with the nature of The Tongariro Alpine Crossing and be aware that the walk could take between 6-10 hours to complete as a group. Whanau volunteers will be required to stay with the group, offering support and motivation as needed.

<u>Please note</u> we have a limited number of bus seats available, and there is no all-day parking at either end of the walk.
