And **busy** with events such as the swimming sports, Rotopounamu trip, Whakapapa clean-up trip, Zero Waste, farm safety day, trout farm visit, and fun days like Crazy Hair Day and Pyjama

Day—as well as the usual teaching of our core subjects.

CLASSROOM KŌRERO –Rimu Ngā Huinga Environmental Student Hui

On Wednesday the 2nd of April six of the oldest students from the senior class were given the opportunity to take part in a student hui held at Ngā Huinga (Cherry Grove). There were 10 schools participating in total. This was organised by Horizons District Council Enviroschools in conjunction with Ngāti Hāua, Violia, Department of Conservation and Ruapehu District Council.



This was a day to educate rangatahi (youth) on the importance of our awa (river) and the cultural significance it holds. We were taught about the native ika (fish), the importance of keeping our awa clean from pollution and rubbish, keep pests out of our native bush, how Taumarunui and surrounding areas get clean water and the cultural significance of the rohe (area) to Ngāti Hāua.

'Green by nature' sponsored and cooked an amazing sausage sizzle and then gave all the tamariki free reusable water bottles.

This was a wonderful educational day, and we look forward to participating in the future.

A significant time for Ngāti Hāua

The local iwi of Ngāti Hāua signed the deed of settlement on Saturday at Ngapuwaiwaha Marae, Taumarunui after eight years of negotiations with the government over breaches of Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Paul Goldsmith delivered an apology on behalf of the crown to four hundred plus people at the marae. He apologised for the harm brought to the iwi of Ngāti Hāua.

I was lucky to be there and be a part of history for our iwi. Me and my mum left at seven o'clock in the morning to get to the marae. When we got there, we had a practice for the haka powhiri and at eight o'clock it all started. We did it twice, once for the local people and again for the government once they arrived a little later. Afterwards we had hāngi for lunch. Then I went to sign the deed of settlement. I was privileged to be able to sign along with three hundred or more people. It was a significant day for Ngāti Hāua and the community of Taumarunui.
