PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES Board Elections

We have our triennial school board elections on the 10th of September this year. We have two current board members standing down, so we need at least two new people to stand. Please consider putting your name forward for this as the board is an integral part of a well-run school. This is not an onerous roll. Basically, you attend one to two meetings per term to oversee the governance of the school. The school board is responsible for:

- policies and procedures
- planning for the future
- employing all school staff
- complying with the law
- managing budgets.

The board doesn't get involved in operational issues. The principal is responsible for the day-to-day running of the school.

Principal Position - Timeline

You may have noticed in the local newspapers that the principal's vacancy has been advertised by the School Board. From the applications a shortlist will be made on the 24th of July. Interviews of these applicants will take place on the 23rd of August. The successful applicant will be notified on the 1st of September. An announcement to the community about who the new principal is will be made sometime after this.

CLASSROOM KÕRERO – Rimu Ngāti Tūwharetoa Taiopenga Kapa Haka Celebration

We are proud to announce that Ōwhango School will be performing at the Ngāti Tūwharetoa Taiopenga Kapa Haka celebration, later this term (week 9). This is the annual school kapa haka festival, held over a three-day period at The Taupō Events Centre Stadium, Taupō. Ōwhango will be performing on Thursday 11 September. This exciting event, held in Taupō, is a celebration of kapa haka — a time to showcase the joy,

discipline, and teamwork involved in Māori performing arts, highlighting whanaungatanga (relationships and connections) and manaakitanga (support and care). Our whole school will travel together to support our kapa haka rōpū (group) and watch kapa haka performances from other schools, making it a full day of culture, connection, and celebration.

Our kapa haka group has now reached full capacity, and we've been incredibly impressed with the enthusiasm shown by our tamariki. The ropu was thoughtfully selected by Whaea Jessie alongside our teaching team. Students were chosen for their commitment to weekly kapa haka practices, their enthusiasm for singing, and their willingness to perform. We are aiming to attend on the same day as other Taumarunui schools to share this special experience together. This is a wonderful opportunity for our tamariki to represent our kura with pride and enjoy the positive, fun spirit of kapa haka.

Senior Group Ski Day One Information for Parents

Year 3 ½ - 8 Friday 18th July 2025

We have 44 students on this trip for years 3 ½ -8 (we have three Year 3 students coming who met the criteria to attend with this group). As our ski camp last year was cancelled, for most it will be the first time skiing for two years so we will be taking things slowly, getting back into the routines, and remembering what to do. I have made a rough guess of what level lesson each student needs, but these will be adjusted on the day if we see evidence that it is not appropriate. Please note that these are not social groups- often children want to be in a group with their mates, rather than at their level.

One change this year is we get all day lessons. These start at 10:30am (we must be there ten minutes before the start) and finish at 3pm, with an hour break at approximately 12:20. Lessons start in Happy Valley.

The day runs like this.

It is an early start- we meet at school at 7:25am and depart school at 7:30am; if you are late, we will not wait. From school we drive up to Whakapapa, turning left at Waimarino (formally known as National Park Village), and right to State Highway 48 past The Chateau and up the Bruce Road to the ski area. You can either drop your students at the very top, in the five-minute drop-off zone (I will be there to oversee them), then find a parking place, or you can find a parking place and then walk up the hill with them. Do not leave any of the kids gear in the car as we do not return to these until the end of the day.

From there we go to Happy Valley to dump our bags in one place then get our ski equipment. We all get fitted with skis, boots and helmets- the younger or newer kids will **need adult help with this please**. Kids need to make sure they do not leave anything behind in the hire shop, often gloves, sunglasses get left behind. I will get the ski passes and hand these out after you have your skis. The kids will also put on their Ōwhango School ski bibs- these must always be worn on the outside of their clothes when skiing so we can easily identify them.

Then it is a good time to go to the toilet and have a snack.

There should be enough time to have some warmup laps skiing down Happy Valley. BUT it is important that the kids are ready for their lesson, standing by the lesson flag meeting area at 10:20am.

Once the lessons are underway the adults can either join in the lesson or have some free time. Meet us back in Happy Valley for lunch at 12:00. After lunch they have the second part of their lesson. There is a possibility that we change the groups around as the ski instructors fine-tune their groupings to ensure that the kids are getting lessons at their current level. Adult helpers are again having free time, until the lesson ends at 3:00pm. At this point we need adult help to manage the students as they are tired, need to return their hire gear, not lose their own gear, return their ski bib and lift pass to Mr Starkey, have a snack, etc. If any carloads want to stay longer (lifts close about 4:30pm) then let me know but note that I need to get the students ski passes and school bibs back. We aim to get the kids back to school at

4pm. If you have a sibling who needs to also be dropped off at school early or stay late, we will have a teacher onsite to look after them.

THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT: all adult helpers must put my cell phone number into their phone so you can contact me on the mountain- 027 631 8631.

Bad Weather

We decide about whether we can proceed by 3pm the day before, this will be emailed out. There is an expectation that we will proceed unless the mountain is closed, even if only Happy Valley is open.

Absences

Please note that to cancel a child's booking, we need to do this 24 hours before the trip to get a refund. So please give me advance notice if you know your child will not be attending, just not turning up on the day means we still need to pay for their day.

Also note that this year skiing is a compulsory part of our physical education programme; there will not be a teacher at school to look after students who do not attend.

A Reminder of the Clothing / Equipment Requirements:

Ski jacket – waterproof and windproof Thermals / Fleece (long sleeved top and leggings)

Ski overalls / pants waterproof Sunscreen, lip balm.

Ski goggles (better for snowy days but can get steamed up on sunny days) and/or sunglasses (best for sunny days)

Warm socks (long woollen socks are best- one pair only as you don't want extra bulk in your ski boots)

A neck warmer or balaclava Helmets are free with ski hire.

Gloves: it is essential they are waterproof, woollen gloves by themselves are **not suitable.** A spare pair is a good idea as they can get wet then cold (especially if the kids are throwing snowballs!)

Tie long hair back, low at the bottom of the neck to fit the helmet over the top.

Layers of clothing are preferable as we get hot, we take off layers but keep on a waterproof outer layer. Also, clip toenails- it helps when toes are in fitted ski boots all day.

Finally, thanks for your assistance with making these trips happen for our kids. Ewan Starkey, Skiing Co-ordinator
