CLASSROOM KŌRERO – KAHIKATEA

While some of our students are away at kapa haka, the rest of us have been learning how to play the ukulele. We've started by practising how to hold the ukulele correctly and how to strum in time to the beat. So far, we've learned four chords – C, G, A minor and F – and we've been using these to play some easy songs such as *Three Little Birds*, *Stay with Me* and *Stand by Me*. Everyone is showing great persistence and enthusiasm as we practise together.

In writing, our focus has been informative writing. We are learning to inform our reader by giving clear, detailed information, explain how something works using facts and steps, and organise our ideas so they are easy to follow. Our current challenge is to invent a new type of wacky transportation and explain exactly how it works using topic-specific vocabulary. Students have planned their inventions in detail, and we have just begun writing. Once the writing is complete, they will create a carefully labelled design to go with it. Here are a few excerpts...

The Bed-a-Plane 2000

The Bed-a-plane 2000 is a form of air transport designed to carry passengers high in the sky in the comfort of their bed. The bed is shaped like a jet to help it glide through the sky easier. The Bed-a-Plane 2000 has huge glass windows all around the bed to give passengers a full view of


