Our Year 7 and 8 tamariki had an amazing day at Ngāpūwaiwaha Marae with Ngāti Hāua. It was an extremely positive experience for all students, filled with manaakitanga (hospitality), whanaungatanga (relationship building / connection) and kotahitanga (unity).

The day began with a whakatau at 10am, followed by a packed programme of korero about Ngāpūwaiwaha Marae, waiata, haka and shared learning. Highlights included the history of the wharenui, powerful Ngāti Hāua haka and waiata practices, fun learning games, a delicious lunch in the wharekai, and capturing the moment with a group photo. We are very grateful to Grant Lethborg from Owhango Adventures for providing the bus transport, and to Jenny Allen for leading the Ngāti Hāua education curriculum that made this day so rich and memorable.

We returned to school with full hearts, where Whaea Wai Patena-Mariu, Hone Smythe and Karen Komene were waiting patiently to continue the learning journey through kapa haka practice. Their guidance is helping prepare our tamariki for the Ngāti Tūwharetoa Taiopenga, and we are so thankful for the support of everyone who made these special experiences possible.
