CLASSROOM KÕRERO – Kõwhai

Kia ora e te whānau,

Thank you for your patience over the last two weeks whilst I have had some absences. Ngā tamariki have had some wonderful learning opportunities across the curriculum with Whaea Marion and have continued their normal literacy and numeracy learning with the support of our amazing teacher aides Whaea Kim and Whaea Maree. Ngā mihi nui!

In maths over the past few weeks, students have been getting to grips with statistics. We began with the basics of sorting and classifying objects, using tally charts to gather data, using pictographs and bar graphs to display data, and learning how to analyse data. We've had fun in and out of the class with investigations like 'What is the most popular school bag colour?', 'What are students' favourite local volcano?' and 'The most popular colour in a bag of skittles?' Students have had to think critically to come up with questions and answers about data they have gathered, and to share their learning with peers.

As part of getting to grips with tally marks/charts, some students used their skip counting and multiplication knowledge to teach younger students more efficient ways to count. It was really neat to see the tuakana-teina relationships develop naturally through mathematics.

In writing, we have had great fun with procedural writing, learning about sequencing and the importance of giving and following clear instructions in a logical sequence. We had a real giggle when I was told to "put the bag of popcorn in the microwave and that's it. That's all you have to do." Well we would have been waiting a long time for our popcorn if Sheeran hadn't said, "Take the plastic wrapper off first, unfold the paper bag, then put it in the microwave". It was still a long wait until Remy gave instructions on setting the microwave and turning it on. The giggles continued when we tried to make fairy bread, with sprinkles on top of a packet of bread but we soon got into the swing of giving, following, reading and writing instructions clearly. Our simple instructions do not make for exciting reading, instead we have included some fairytale narratives from our awesome authors:
