Measles cases in Aotearoa

The Ministry of Education has asked me to share the following information with you.

Recent measles cases linked to overseas travel have been reported in Te Tai Tokerau and Queenstown. Cases were active in the community while infectious and there is a risk of measles circulating there, and more widely in Aotearoa.

Points to share with parents, caregivers and the school community:

- Measles is very contagious and can make people of any age very sick.
- Watch for measles symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes and a blotchy rash.

OWHANGO SCHOOL PET DAY & SPRING FESTIVAL ACTIVITIES

Our Pet Day and Spring Festival will be held on Monday 13th October 2025. On this day parents and the community can come along after 12:01pm to view the creations and watch the animals being judged.

Students may make a **minimum of two** and a **maximum of four** individual activities below: A GIFT

♦ A gift for a grandparent.

COOKING

- ♦ Baking decorated like an animal or in a spring theme, packaged or sliced and priced if going on the sales table.
- ♦ Homemade sweets & other baking packaged or sliced and priced if going on the sales table.

GROWING

- ♦ A growing container garden, e.g., tub of vegies, hanging basket etc
- ♦ A decorative sand saucer or miniature garden

CONSTRUCTING

These two activities may be a group or an individual activity:

- ♦ A Lego creation- in either a spring theme or pet theme
- ♦ A large raft judging criteria: that will support at least one person and can paddle the length of the school pool, bonus points for engineering skills and decorative skill.
- ♦ A small boat judging criteria: that it will stay afloat while all of the rafts are paddled the length of the pool; bonus points for engineering skills and decorative skill.

 PRESCHOOL
 - ♦ There is a table for pre-schoolers to make something that fits any of the above categories.

RULES

- These are all to be prepared at home.
- Creations must be made by the students, NOT the parents and not store bought.
- > Please do not name your work; we will give you stickers with your special anonymous code on it.
- Students will be doing additional activities at school that will be on display.
- You may make a minimum of two and a maximum of four individual activities
- Students wishing to sell their creation must price it beforehand.

Sales Table

After the judging of the displays, the children will be able to offer their work for sale. This year all of the money goes to the child who made the item for sale. The year 7 & 8 children will manage the sales table. The children will need to price their own goods on arrival at school.

House Points

The children win points for their house group in every event, as follows-

First= 3 points Second= 2 points











Third= 1 point
